Bubble Painting



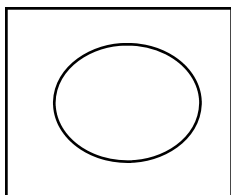
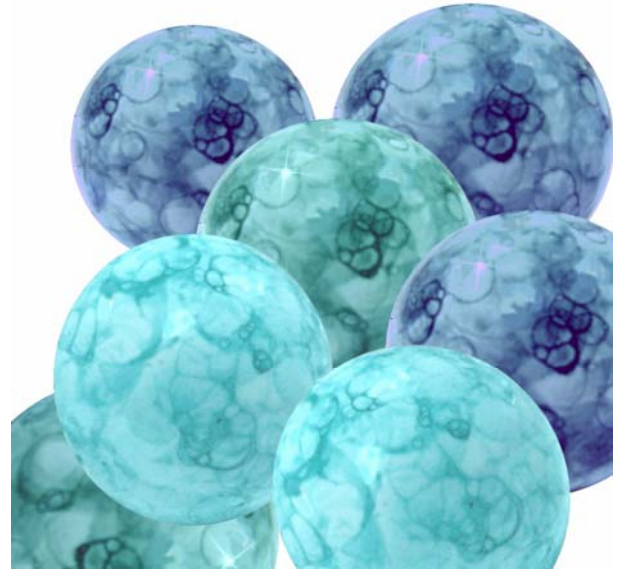
Bubble Painting: Application achieved by adding liquid detergent to a Color Concentrate Wash to create a background.

Project Focus: Shows color strength with maximum product dilution before applying.

Supplies Needed:

Styrofoam cup
Colors For Earth Color Concentrates
Dish washing detergent like Joy or Ivory
Plastic drinking straw
Water
Spoon for stirring
Newspaper plus paper towels for your work surface.

1. Tear the Styrofoam cup .. so that the depth is about 2 or 2 1/2" tall.
2. Mix 2 Tablespoons color, 2 Tablespoons water together. To this mixture add 1 drops of dish detergent. Stir thoroughly.
3. Using the plastic straw, place it in the color mixture and blow gently to create bubbles.
4. Once you have achieved a mound of bubbles over the top of the cup, remove the straw and press the piece of bisque gently into the bubble mass.
5. Or you might try rolling your bisque into the bubbles.. it creates a nice effect with a bigger bubble pattern. Work your way around the bisque, much as you would if you were sponging.
6. Allow pieces to dry thoroughly before applying 2 to 3 coats of a CG900 Crystal Clear Glaze.
7. Fire to cone 06.



White space on your piece can be created by taping or using contact paper cut outs to mask an area before bubbling.
