

Aged Metal is an application technique. The finished surface is a semi-rough matt. There can be elements of a satin metallic finish in areas. This is a water tight finished glaze.

This application is perfect for any ware that would lend itself to an antique metal finish. A warm patina for garden pieces... planters.. frames, boxes, jardinières, etc.

The following is a color guide and instructions to produce Aged Metal Verdi Gris.

Colors You Will Need.

CGE 501 Black Patent Color Concentrates

CC162 Laurel Green CC151 Cerulean Blue CC165 Hunter Green



- 1. Begin with 04 bisque
- 2. Apply 2 coats of CGE501 Black Patent
- 3. Mix 1 part CGE501 Black Patent to 1 part CSP10 Terra Firma. Mix well. *If you are unsure of mixing and measuring "simple mixes"* see the Guide to Simple Mixes.
- 4. With a wool sponge apply one coat over the entire piece. You are trying to achieve "texture" so make sure you do not pounce too hard to flatten your texture out completely.
- 5. Warning.. Do not dry the last step with a hair dryer. As soon as it is dry to the touch you can proceed with the next steps.
- 6. On a tile place the CC162 and CC165.
- 7. Using a Silk Sponge load an area with Laurel then tip in Hunter Green. Begin pouncing repositioning sponge with each pounce. Leave the background showing through because this results in a metallic layer and you want this to show. There should be a distinction. Work your way around the entire surface. DO NOT TRY FOR SOLID COVERAGE. The background is a key color and not just texture..
- 8. Apply highlights of CC151 Cerulean Blue as highlights using a sponge in a light lacey pouncing motion... YOUR BACK GROUND SHOULD STILL BE SHOWING.
- 9. Apply a second coat of the Cerulean using your sponge.

Allow the ware to dry. Stilt and fire to cone 06.

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
